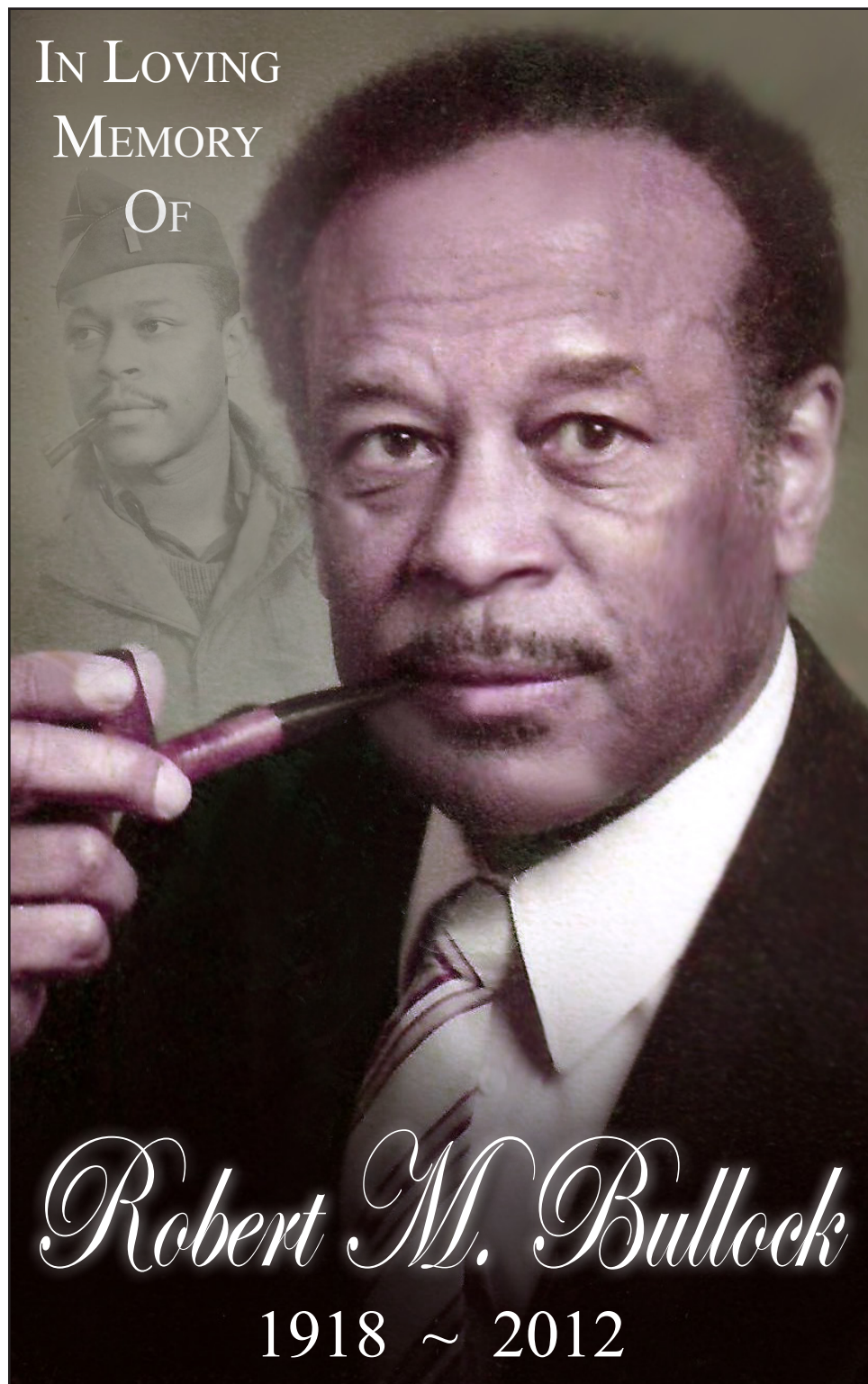

OBITUARY

Robert (Bob) Bullock was born on April 10, 1918 to the union of Johnny and Emma Bullock in Eufaula, Alabama. He was one of seven children. The family later moved to the Dayton area where Bob completed his secondary education. Bob graduated from Central State University earning a bachelors degree in 1941. On August 26, 1941 Bob enlisted in the U.S. Army first to attend Officer's Candidate School. In 1942 he received the Commission of 1st Lieutenant where he served as an ordnance officer supervising the use of high explosives in World War II. The decorations and citations he received include the European-African-Middle Eastern Theater Ribbon, American Theater Ribbon, Victory Medal Ribbon and the American Defense Ribbon.

Bob married Ms. Anita Branner. This union produced two children: R. Michael Bullock and Terrance E. Bullock. One son, Michael, preceded Bob in death at age ten (10). While living in Dayton, Ohio Bob held various positions including work at the U.S. Postal Service and as a junior high school teacher. Bob moved to Cleveland, Ohio in the 1970s to work beside his older brother, Albert, at the famed Bullock's Dry Cleaners on E. 105 Avenue. Bob had many interests including membership in Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Cleveland. At that time Bob began his long mentorship of two brothers, Johnnie (Chip) and Dwayne Allen. Bob ended his career in the 1980s with the Cuyahoga County Welfare Department's Career Advancement Program. In that position, he helped others acquire skills to find sustainable employment to earn a living wage.

Bob leaves to celebrate his life son Terrance Bullock of Dayton, Ohio; brother James Bullock of Bedford Heights, Ohio; *Mentees*, Dwayne Allen of Atlanta, Georgia and Johnnie (Chip) Allen (Antoinese) of Westerville, Ohio; and an extended family at the Indian Hills Senior Community.

Bob was always known as a gentleman with great intelligence, grace and style. His friendship and dedication to his family and friends cannot be matched. He will be truly missed.
